How did you get involved with CWA?

I have been a member of CWA since 1988. As long as I can remember I have always had an interest in the political process. CWA appealed to me because of the strong prayer emphasis, consistent message and dedication to uphold Biblical family values.

Over the past several years, I have felt the Lord leading me to a more active involvement in grassroots prayer action. The 2000 presidential election was a wake-up call. It showed me how critical it is to elect state leaders who value integrity and will uphold Godly principles. In states where elected officials appoint judges, the character of those state leaders is critical.

What do you find rewarding about being a state director?

One of my favorite parts is the people that I have met while working on issues in the state. It is encouraging to work side-by-side with others that have the same desire to protect our children, families and communities.


What is your greatest concern?

There is a great concern with the radical homosexual agenda aimed at Georgia, especially in the middle schools where there is a rise in homosexual administrators and counselors. Counselors have a tremendous influence on students—they are sent to talk with them when a disaster occurs or when the students simply need to talk.

Recently the Cobb County School Board voted to allow alternative theories of the origin of the species to be taught in the classroom. How were you involved?

I and other CWA members sent over 3700 newsletters to residents in Cobb County and across the state, informing them of the issue. I sent letters to the school board and Superintendent Joseph Redden urging them to uphold the initial decision. Students deserve to hear both sides of the debate and then decide for themselves what is truth.

What do you hope to accomplish?

My heart's desire is to see Prayer/Action Chapters established in every county in Georgia. The foundation for building a strong state chapter in Georgia begins with our Prayer/Action Chapters. Human effort will never return our communities and nation to the roots of our Founding Fathers. But prayer will change hearts, redirect events, change public policy and point people to Christ.
