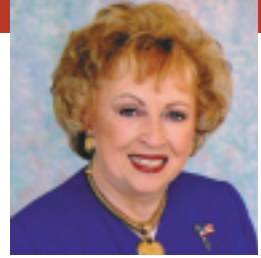


Chairman's Desk
